- Applicants who receive all decisions by 14 May must reply by 5 June, or their application will be declined by default (unless they're in Extra). In the Adviser Portal, use 'Has accepted offer(s)' to see who's accepted, and 'Waiting for applicant's reply' to see those who haven't – including their reply by date.
- Adviser Live: Supporting students on results day Join us at 12:30 on 4 June for expert insights, practical strategies, and live Q&A to help you guide students through results day. Register now
- The Adviser Portal is now open for the 2026 cycle. Make sure multiple staff members are set up so your team is ready to manage applications from day one.
- Remember to check your payment set-up in the Adviser
 Portal we've added a new option to support the Free School Meals application fee waiver. Read the guide.
- Students can start their applications on the Hub from 13
 May. Get them ready with our personal statement classroom resources.

UCAS Tariff points for apprenticeships: new for 2026

From May, Level 3/SCQF Level 6 apprenticeships will be included in the UCAS Tariff Tables – with points appearing in the Tariff Calculator from September 2025. These <u>Tariff points</u> will apply to higher education entry from September 2026 onwards.
